Paris, March 31.—The first civil tribunal of the Seine today decided the case of the republic of Colombia against the Panama Canal Co., in favor of the defendants. George Hansen, a fireman in the employ of the Clatsop Mill Company, was arrested yesterday on a charge of seduction preferred by Miss Airla Lorenson. The young woman alleges that the offense was committed under the promise of marriage. She formerly resided in Astoria, but removed to Portland, where she lived up to a year ago, when she returned here to live with

an uncle. The prosecution's case was preliminarily heard before Justice Goodman yesterday afternoon, and it developed during the hearing that the woman is a mother. The examination was continued by the court until morning, Hansen being released from custody upon giving cash bail.

At the Commercial alleys last night the talent had a losing streak, the Leaders, Mikkelsen's lucky aggregation, being touched up for four straight games, and the Japs losing two of the four. It was Stupp's team that had the distinction of defeating the Leaders, and in every game except the second, where there was a margin of but five pins, the victory was decisive. The Japs lost the first game by one pin, the second by seven, won the third by four and the last by two. All of the four games were won in the last frame and the contest proved an exciting one. Pye's 187 was the best four-game total of the night. Peterson bowled 716 and Stupp finished with 170.

The owner of a team of bay horses, as to the treatment of which an Astoria woman had occasion to express herself rather forcibly a few days ago in The Astorian, denies that he has been cruel to the team, and says the animals have been well fed at all times since he owned them. He likewise stated the horses were properly housed and said he was not ashamed for anyone to see them. One of the horses has a lame fore foot, but the driver says the horse is well able to do all the duty which he requires of it. The animals do not look any too robust, but the owner says they are well fed.

Chief Quartermaster F. G. Hodgson, at Vancouver Barracks, has advertised for bids for about 4,500,000 feet of lumber, also a number of doors and blinds, the material to be used in the erection of 11 new buildings at Fort McKinley, the Philippines. Proposals will be received up to April 20. This is the biggest order the government has called for since the capitulation of Manila, and represents two large steamer cargoes. The authorization given the quartermaster's department for the lumber also carries with it a large quantity of galvanized steel roofing and building material of other kinds, bids or which will probably be asked at a later date.

Biggest Life Insurance Policy.
New York, April 1.—J. C. Colgate, member of the New York exchange, has taken out a life insurance policy for \$1,500,000. This is said to be the largest policy ever taken out on a human life.
