It seems a great pity that such a word as "trust' should acquire a new and somewhat unsavory sig. nificance, says the Ledger. The meaning which the word had in its original and primary use is closely related to the word "true," which has the same root. What is true may be relied upon, and trust is reliance upon the truth, or upon the veracity, integrity, justice, friendship or other virtue or sound principle of another. The word has a deep and pre
eious meaning in religion, something akin to either eious meaning in religion, something akin to either
faith or hope, a confident expectation based upon as faith or hope, a confident expectation based upon assurances that are divine and therefore can not fail. The word became a useful word when extended,
without loss of this significance, to business affairs. Trust is credit in business, and this is based upon confidence in the honety of other people and their ability and willingness to pay. In law and equity the word aequired a technical significance, but one that presupposes a worthy bestowal of confidence. It is a trust when property is placed in the hands of may be benefited by it.
