| A Gardening Bird. <br> There is only one creature that we know of bestden mankind which shaws its apprectation of flowers and green foliage by adoming lte home with them, and that in the "gariener btrd" of New Guinea (Amblyornis inornatias), a member of the familly of bower birds which are peenliar to the Gulnea. Some naturalistis place these bower birds among the birde of paradiae. The first account of this singuhar appreciation of fioral beauty by birds was given by Signor Becearl. who says that they bulld a hut about two feet in height, with a central sup. port of a small tree krowing in a glade or clearing in the dense forests. The roof, which slopes to the ground. is composed of the stems of the orchids placed in "a radiating fashion. In the interior, access to which to by an angutar apaning. the central support is covered with moss in the form of a sone, so that a cfrealar promenade is made between it and the slop. ing roof. But the extraordinary effort of this bird ie evidenced outalde this playhouse, for in front if it is lald out, with infnite care truly, a garden. Fresh mose is brought by the dilis sent occupants, and a verdant carpet, extending about alx feet, fis first prepared, on which are lald blowsoms and berties of every variety in profuston to dellght the eyes. As these withar or become unalghtly they are removed and lald in a heap at the back of the hut, presumably out of aight of these ultrarefined ilttle blrds, and upon the mossy lawn are placed continually fresh blooms. An fir as is known each of these habrtations is occupled only by oue palr of oirds, and it is not certain whether the tasteful decorations are arranged by the male only; it would be pleas. ant to think that it was so-that all this refined effort wae made but to show his devotion and to make some litule reparation for his lack of beauty and dingy appearance.-Westminiater Gazntte. <br> Water From Cactus. <br> F.
