We are in reeeipt of a letter from W. S. U'Ren of Oregon City, seeretary of the Direct Primary Nominations League, asking us to lend our support to the direct primary law which will be voted upon by the people of Oregon at the coming state election. With
the letter comes a circular from Michigan, which attacks the present method of making nominations and urges revolt against "machine" methods in polities. We are unable to find any redeeming feature in the direct primary law, and must, therefore, advise voters to cast their ballots against it. Its principal feature is contrary to American principles. This law requires that a man shail state his polities and be
known as republican, demoerat, socialist, prohibitionist or whatever political faith he may select. There are, unfortunately, a great many persons who can not afford to declare themselves politically. These men have families to support, and partisan politics

We had a case of this kind in Astoria only a few years ago, when
the "eitizen" candidate for police commissioner wa elected, notwithstanding his name did not appear o the ballot. Voters went to the polls and wrote his name on the ballots which were handed to them.
