## **FAREWELL OF INDRASAMHA**

Oriental Liner Departs Today to Return no More to the Columbia River.

TAKES ONLY PARTIAL CARGO

Nicomedia, New German Liner, Is Next Vessel Due From Far East-Other Maritime Happenings.

When the oriental liner Indrasamha leparts from the Columbia river today she will cross the bar for the last time, exept in the event that she chartered at some later date to ply between the Columbia and the far east. She is the last of the Indras to quit the service. The next vessel to arrive her from the orient will be the away. Nicomedia, which departed from Yokohama April 30, and which is due about May 18.

The Indrasamha arrived down the river yesterday with only a partial cargo of stuff for the orient. Two other oriental liners were in port when the Indrasamha arrived, and there was not enough freight to go around. Now, the China Commercial freighters have been withdrawn from the run, and the four German vessels under charter to the O. R. & N. Co. cargoes.

Captain Craven has been making this port ever since the oriental service was established and is well known here. Yesterday he bade his friends farewell, expressing the hope he would some day return again to the Columbia

The Indrasamha's cargo is valued at only \$60,692. She takes 7,307 barof flour, worth \$26.302; 33,332 bushels of wheat, valued at \$26,000 160,000 feet of lumber, worth \$1600 and sundry consignments of freight worth \$6790. Four Japanese passengers are aboard for Kobe, and there are 12 Chinese passengers for Hongkong. Of the Chinese four went aboard at Astoria, Five of the Chinese are being sent back by the government offi-

POSER FOR THE OFFICIALS.

Don't Know What to Do With Waif Who Stowedaway.

New York, May 5 .- A newsboy walf who has had two free rides across the Atlantic is being held at Ellis island by the immigrant officials. They have been compelled to refer his case to the department at Washington because it lacks precedent.

The lad, Samuel Mrganlander, is 7 years old. His parents brought him here from Germany and both father and mother died some time ago. The child made enough money by selling newspapers to sustain life. About a month ago he wandered aboard a French steamer to get warm, and, lying down in the steamer, fell asleep. When he awoke the ship was far at sea and he was ordered to get up for his meal. Apparently the officers did not discyer that the child was a stow-At Havre he went ashore and the United States consul general got him a job in a restaurant until the next French liner sailed. The vessel brought him back, but he is destitute and an alien, so the immigrant officials held him up pending instructions,
