OLD CHIEF DEAD.

Was Dangerous in His Hime-Buried in Indian Style.

Uklah, Cal., May 24.-Charles Penlo the oldest chief of the Ukiah tribe is dead at Cook Ranchero, and the Indians are now celebrating a death feast. Penio was 107 years old and ruled the Ukiahs long before the white settler arrived and the death of many whites lies at his door. He was judge and jury for the tribe but was deposed about 25 years ago for killing Sam Warden. Warden and another Indian had a quarrel over a game of cards and the Indian was killed. Penio was sent for and had Warden tied to a tree to be shot. He dodged the first bullet, which so infurlated the chief that he selzed an axe and chopped off Werden's head, Penio was held in jail for several months. but none of the Indians could be induced to testify against him. Penlo had always resented the encroachment of the whites and was considered dangerous. He was burled in Indian style with his pony and war implements.


