## SHIPMENTS ARE HEAVY

Lumber Exports From Columbia for Month of May Break All Records.

TOTAL NEARLY 20,000,000 FEET

Domestic and Foreign Cargoes About Even—Shipments of Other Stuffs Lighter Than Usual.

Lumber exports, domestic and foreign, from the Columbia river during the month of May aggregated almost 20,000,000 feet, surpassing the total of any other month for a long time. Foreign shipments slightly exceeded domestic cargoes. Despite the falling off in blue-water shipping, the lumber traffic brought many vessels to port, and the month proved a very busy one.

Twenty vessels departed from the Columbia during the month with full or partial cargoes. The total domestic shipments were 8,566,939. Ten vessels clearing for foreign ports took lumber to the extent of 9,977,972 feet, making the grand total shipments for May 19, 544,911 feet.

**Hyades Reaches Port.**

The American steamship Hyades reached port yesterday from Tacoma on a trip for the government. She has never before been here. The big freighter registers almost 3,000 tons and presents a more attractive appearance than most of the carriers of her class. She is commanded by Captain George Wright and is under charter to the government to carry lumber to Manila. The Hyades proceeded up the river without stop.

**Nome Fleet Sails.**

Seattle, May 31.—Three vessels of the first Nome fleet, the steamships Oregon, Tacoma and Senator, sail tomorrow. They have about 1,100 passengers booked.

**Marine Notes.**

The barkentine George C. Perkins arrived yesterday from California to load lumber.

The schooner Alpha arrived yesterday from California to load lumber. The raft contains 130,000 feet.

The four-masted schooner Irene arrived down the river yesterday. She has a cargo of lumber for San Pedro.

The steamer Aurella arrived yesterday from San Francisco with 3,867 packages of merchandise for Astoria, and 4,665 packages of merchandise for Portland.

The pilot schooner Pulitzer came inside yesterday and will remain until she is overhauled. The San Jose will replace her outside the Heads within a few days.

The British ship Beacon Rock arrived last evening from Port Los Angeles. She brings a partial cargo from Antwerp. The Beacon Rock registers about 1,800 tons and is commanded by Captain Hughes.

### NEBRASKA CONVENTION.

**Bryan Will Dictate to the Delegates at Omaha Today.**

Omaha, May 31.—The democratic leaders from different parts of the state began arriving today for the democratic state convention, which will be held in this city Wednesday. Indications now are that William J. Bryan's friends will completely dominate the convention, the county convention in Douglass county last Saturday having eliminated the last hope of the "reorganizers" to secure recognition. The convention, in addition to selecting four delegates-at-large, will also name two delegates for each district to the national convention and adopt a platform which is expected to reflect the views of Bryan. Mr. Bryan himself will probably be elected to lead the Nebraska delegation at the St. Louis convention. No contests are anticipated, only one county having elected delegates directly opposed to the Kansas City platform.

### Stoned to Death.

Chicago, May 31.—A dispatch to the Record-Herald from Anderson, Ind., says: Hiram Staley, a young business man, has been stoned to death just after stepping from an electric car at Chest-erfield, five miles east of here. His assailants have not been identified and their motive is not known.

### David Fraser Dead.

Chicago, May 31.—David R. Fraser, one of the founders of what is now the Ails-Chalmers Company, and identified with the concern until 1893, is dead of apoplexy. He was 80 years old. Mr. Fraser was the inventor of machinery which almost revolutionized the mining industry, and amassed a fortune in its manufacture.

### Japs Lose Ships.

Mukden, May 31.—The Japanese on the night of May 28 made another attempt to block Port Arthur by sinking merchant vessels in the harbor entrance. The attempt was discovered through the operations of a search-light and one Japanese gunboat and two torpedo boat destroyers were sunk. The merchantment then retired.

### Refuses to Drive.

New York, May 31.—S. F. Edge, who was selected by the race committee of the Automobile Club as first driver to represent Great Britain in the international automobile cup race, has asked the club to relieve him of that honor, says a Herald dispatch from London. The reason for his action is not stated.

New York, May 31.—Crookshank Pasha, who is to represent the Khedive of Egypt at the St. Louis Fair, has arrived from Europe.
