Green River, Wyo., June 1 .- Floods in he Green river and tributaries has cost at least two lives and much damage to property. A messenger has just arrived here with news from the inundated district. It is his opinion that the death list may be greatly increased when complete reports come in. The known dead:

As there are no bridges across these streams above this place and the fords are impassable, communication with other settlements is cut off. It is not expected that the damage done by high water can be estimated with accuracy for weeks.
