The largest fish bring the best prices, as the large sides make a thick slice when cut up and do not dry out too much in the process of smoking, which usually requires two or three days, and should be done to produce the best results in or near the place where consumed. It is said to be the very best of the salmon business and sells for more than any grade of frozen or canned salmon.

This Year's Pack.

Thus far, it is said, the catch on the Columbia river is lighter than a year ago. The season there opened April 13, and while there has been a fair run of small fish, large ones have been fewer and a smaller quantity of fish have been placed in cold storage. On Puget sound, also, the run is light and cannot be said to have begun. Hardly enough fresh salmon have been secured for current demand. It is early yet, however, to expect them in large lines, but if passenger wishes to requantities and canneries are not open.
