### ACCIDENT AT CIRCUS

Many Are Injured by Collapse of Tent and Seats During Performance in Chicago.

BOYS **PROPS**

Chicago, June 18 .- Nearly 100 people have sunk in a struggling, yelling mass through splintered board in a collapse of a reserved section of seats during the performance of a circus here. It is known that one man, six women and two children were seriously hurt, and it is supposed that scores more were injured whose names were not reported to the police.

The panic among the 2000 people in the tent was intensified by the plunging of two horses that broke from the ring in which they were performing excitement the treasurer disappeared with over \$600 of the show's money. It is supposed the accident was due

to the removal of the back props outside the tent by boys. The side props were found to have been broken off and some of the were rotten.

#### Making the Deaf Hear.

Dr. Marage of Boug la Reine, France. has made experiments on developing the hearing of deaf mutes, and his results have been communicated to the Academie de Medicine. Twenty-four stone deaf children were divided by lot into two parts and those of one group were submitted every day to the vibrations of a "vowel siren" which he has invented for this "massage" tympanum or drum of the ear. end of six weeks all the subjects could near sounds of musical instruments for the first time, three heard phrases spoken near the ear and two heard conversation carried on over a yard distant in the ordinary voice. The 65 52 siren also enables the hearing to be measured with precision.
