New York, July 4.-Defying the Brooklyn Rapid Transit Company to collect a second fare between Brooklyn and Coney Island, nearly 1000 passengers were ejected during Sunday when the cars reached Neck road, where the second nickel is taken. British Warship Venerable's Prize Firin Off Malta.

New York, July 4 .- H. M. S. Venerable has just created a world's record in prize firing off Malta, according to a Herald dispatch from London. One of the Venerable's 12-inch barbette guns fired nine rounds in three minutes and scored nine bits.

The following was the actual record of the foremost barbette, the time occupied in each case being three minutes: Turret, 9 rounds, 5 hits; right gun, 9 rounds, 9 hits; left gun. 5 rounds, 5 hits. Total, 23 rounds, 19
