MISTAKEN FOR A DEER.

S. E. Meminger, pastor of the Mount Tabor M. E. church of Portland. Pyle was brought to Portland yesterday morning and was taken to the Good Samaritan hospital, where he is resting easily with good chances of complete recovery. Pyle's father, who was also in the woods, was communicated with, and it was decided to bring the boy to Portland. where he could be taken to a hospital and properly treated. Accordingly. camp was broken and the party journeyed to the railway and took the train for Portland. As soon as the train arrived Pyle was removed to the hospital and his wound properly dressed.


