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WAS NOT THE "BLACK HAND"

Italian Murdered in New York Not a Victim of the Blood Thirsty Society as Supposed.

DRUNKEN DEBTOR DID IT

When Asked to Settle the Man Became Abusive and When Ordered Out Drew a Pistol and Shot Bossoto.

New York, Aug. 25.—It has developed that the killing of Salvatore Bossoto early yesterday in his father's Italian boarding house in Park street was not connected with the "Black Hand" or Mafia societies, but a crime of ordinary character.

The shooting which caused great excitement in the Italian quarter and an attack on the murderer, was done by a drunken relative of young Bossoto's mother. The man had borrowed money and also ran up a bill in the restaurant. Upon being asked to settle he became abusive and was ordered out. He drew a pistol and fired.

Caballistic signs made with chalk and found on the door of the Bossoto home were supposed at first to indicate that the family had been marked for killing, but were probably placed there by children at play. Numerous other marks of the same kind were found on the doors and sidewalks in the neighborhood.

Young Bossoto was extremely popular in the Italian quarter because of his fine singing. He was being educated for an operatic career.

London Mail:—A Japanese priest who was on board the transport Sado Maru and saw the Russian cruisers sink the Hitachi Maru states:

"We observed a column of white smoke rising from the Hitachi Maru which smoke shortly afterward disappeared. Before the transport sank a woman appeared on the deck of one of

the Russian warships, which I think was the Rurik.

"She stood against the ship's rail and waved a handkerchief, smiling and chatting as the Hitachi went down. She was evidently pleased at the destruction of the vessel for her country's sake.

"We were furious with indignation at the behavior of this woman, and feared that she would repeat it when the Sado Maru went down. We all felt angry and wished we could curse her to death with our dying breath if we had to die. We were astonished at the sight of a woman on a warship."

NOT TO OPEN ON SUNDAY

World's Fair Officials Deny That There Is Any Foundation for Rumor of Open Gates.

HAVE CONTRACT WITH U. S.

Members and Officers of the Exposition Company Under Heavy Bonds to Carry Out Agreement With Government.

St. Louis, Aug. 25.—Despite stories of the possibility of Sunday opening, which have been printed broadcast of late, it has been declared by a representative of the exposition company that such a discussion was not taken seriously by the board of directors or the executive committee. It is the desire of the exposition officials to give the public to understand that the suggestion of open gates on Sunday is absolutely futile. Secretary Walter B. Stevens stated that circumstances made it impossible for the exposition to be opened on Sunday, no matter how loud the protests of prospective patrons might be, and that the project had never been discussed by the board of directors.

"The members of the board of directors of the world's fair signed a contract with the United States government stipulating that the exposition was not to be opened on Sunday," said Secretary Stevens. "They are bonded individually in large amounts to carry out this contract. The talk of a 'loophole' in the agreement is unfounded. There is not even a possibility that the world's fair will be opened on Sunday, much less a probability. Further discussion of the question is useless."

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
