

TALES OF CITIES.

The public library at Nashua, N. H., has this sensible rule: "No person is allowed to have in his possession any one paper more than twenty minutes." Hurley, Wis., appears to be the champion bad town of the country. With a population of only 1,800 people it has forty-seven licensed saloons and six gambling houses.



Governor Beekman Winthrop. Judge Beekman Winthrop, who was appointed governor of Porto Rico by President Roosevelt to succeed William H. Hunt, is a personal friend of the president, and the ability he showed as an administrator and magistrate while holding an important position in the



Philippines commended him for pr motion as the chief executive of Porto Rico. He went to the Philippines as assistant executive secretary to the Philippine commission. During a stay in the United States two years ago he met the president, and shortly afterward Mr. Roosevelt appointed him judge of the Philippine court of first instance.
