Koreans Petition Emperor for Strong Anti-Foreign Policy.

New York, Sept. 16 .- The Japanes. ald disputch from Seoul, Korea, that ordered to quit at once, his government immediately undertake the construction of a railway from Seoul to Gensan under military engianese hold no concession for this line but under the terms of the Japanese-Korean protocol signed in February of this year, they can claim the right for strategic purposes.

The milway, once laid, may later be operated as a commercial venture, greatly assisting in the development and colonization plans for the Korean peninsula. The construction of the railroad connecting Fusan with Masampho was commenced a week ago under Japanese military engineers.

For the last week, parties of Korean officials have been pursuing the ancient pla direct. custom of kneeling before the palace gates, praying the acceptance of a memorial petitioning the emperor to adopt a strong anti-foreign policy. The emperor has thus far refused to accept the petitions.

New York, Sept. 16 .- Herman E. The commissioner recently denounced a number of the sergeants as worthless in the detection of crime.

The commissioner declared it to his purpose to crush lawlessness, check the numerous burglaries and looting of apartments, and to make the streets absolutely safe for unprotected women at night.
