Charge.

New York, Sept. 16 .- A customs decision of considerable importance to wheat growing and cattle raising interests of the west and northwest has been made by the board of general appraisers. It sustains a protest made by a Minneapolis dealer against the classification for duty as "wheat" at 25 cents a bushel of an article described in the invoice as "wheat screenngs," and returned by the deputy colector at Minneapolis as "feed wheat." In reality it was stated to be wheat from Canada, which, because of early frosts. had not matured.

The appraisers declared that the ordinary commercial meaning must be applied in interpreting the tariff law; that the grain under consideration is not fit to be made into flour or for human food, and it is incapable of germination and its only use is as feed for cattle and fowl. The claim that it is dutiable at only 10 per cent as an unenumerated, unmanufactured article was sustained.

YACHT'S CREW MISSING.

Craft Found Capsified With All Sails

Chicago, Sept. 16 .- A nameless capsized yacht, found in the lake and brought to Chicago, is believed by boatmen to indicate that the crew has been drowned. The fact that the sails were set is held as additional proof.

The steamer Virginia sighted the craft when just north of Waukegan and five miles from shore. The yacht would accommodate six persons.

BALLIET AGAIN IN COURT.

Threatened Sale of His Mining Stock as Delinquent.

San Francisco, Sept. 16,-Letson Ballet and his wife began suit today against the present board of directors of the White Swan Mines Company, limited, to prevent the sale of their stock for a delinquent assessment of 5 cents per share. There have been issued in his name 83,680 shares and in Mrs. Balliet's name 133,000 shares. Balliet was formerly in control of the
