Mammoth New Packing Plant For Chicago.

Chicago, Cept. 17.-Chicago is to have a new packing house plant, capitalized at \$2,500,000 and with a daily capacity of 1000 head of cattle, 2000 hogs and 5000 sheep. The company has been incorporated under the laws of New York and negotiations for a site at the Union stockyards are under way. The plant is expected to be erected and in working order by May 19, 1905.

A group of New York capitalists is said to be back of the enterprise and an avowed intention of the company is to help create healthy competition in the packing industry. The concern will have branches in New York, Chicago and the important packing centers of the west.

A line of refrigerator cars will be run in connection with the new plant.

LAWS SHOULD **BE STRONGER**

Oregon Statutes Not Rigid Enough to Successfully Prevent Forest Fires.

REVISION IS BADLY NEEDED

Multnomah Legislator Says He Favors Some Action at Forth. coming Session of Leglature.

In the opinion of timbermen, of legislators and of attorneys, the forest protection laws of Oregon are weak and

As far as known Oregon's laws relating to forest fires suggest no means by which the danger of fire shall be Stevens branch, arriving Ft. Stevens REPORT OF THE CONDITION OF lessened, as they deal only with penalties which may be imposed on any person responsible for the starting of a fire. Sections 1787 to 1792, Bellinger and Cotton's code, give the forest fire laws of Oregon in full, including the section which makes it the duty of the governor of the state to issue a proclamation July 1 of each year, calling attention to these laws. This section also charges the judges of circuit courts to call the attention of grand furies to these sections in issuing in-

structions to jurors. William T. Muir, representative from Multnomah county, states that while he has no definite idea of what should be done, the forest fires which yearly ravage the country are a very great evil and there should be action taken. which seems to soive the problem and insure a minimum number of fires," he stated. "Somebody must do something that will end this condition of things. It can not last forever for all of the good timber will soon disappear."

TIT FOR TAT.

Refuse Recognition of Canadian Steamboat Inspection.

Chicago, Sept. 17.—Because it refused to pay an inspection fee of \$100 the Canadian steamer Arabian has been forbidden to carry passengers from Chicago.

This grows out of the refusal of the Canadian government in 1898 to accept the American inspection of steam vesvels. In retallation, the United States government adopted a similar rule and the Arabian now suffers from it.

Italian Soldiers Assault Chinese in Pekin.

Pekin, Sept. 17.-An extraordinary fracas between Italian and Chinese soldiers occurred on Thursday afternoon, September 15. It appears that two Chinese soldiers were out walking unarmed along the public road bordering upon the Italian drill grounds adjoining the Italian legation. They stopped to watch the Italians drilling. The Italians ordered them away and when they refused to go a fight ensued. The two Chinese were beaten. into the Italian legation while the other ran to the residence of General named bank, do solemnly swear that Chiang Kweite, who is commander in the above statement is true to the best chief of the Chinese troops stationed

> A dozen Italians followed him and fired two shots into the residence and one Italian soldler entered. Chinese soldiers assembled prepared to fight but one of their officers prevented further disturbance.

> Representations have been made by the Chinese authorities to the Italian legation but no answer has yet been received. Great indignation is felt and expressed upon all sides at the unprovoked and unwarranted attack. It is hoped, however, that the incident will be arranged without any compli-
