## IS AFTER THE PRESIDENCY

Here is Mr. Inman's announcement. In which he hands a few to the plutocrats and others of the ilk foreign to the political hereditaments of James Inman, Esquire:

**FLOATING ISLAND**—One quart rich milk put into double boiler, add three table-spoonfuls sugar; when hot drop into it the whites of two eggs beaten stiff; drop by the teaspoonful, let remain a few minutes, then remove these "islands" from milk. To the hot milk, stirring continually, add the beaten yolks of three eggs and the whites of two. Remove from fire as quickly as it begins to thicken, pour into a deep glass dish and when cool drop over the top the cooked whites of the eggs. The custard may be flavored with lemon or vanilla.
