BLUE LIGHT ANESTHETIC

Swiss Professors Discover New and Remarkable System for Painless Dentistry.

LEAVES NO BAD EFFECTS

Sixteen Candle Power Blue Light Effects Nervous System in Three Minutes Sufficiently to Allay Senses of Pain. THE PRINTS

Washington, Sept. 21.-After three years of patient research two professors of Geneva, Switzerland, have discovered a new anesthetic which promises to revolutionize the practice of dentistry. In reporting to the state department, Consul Leifield as Frefburg, Germany, states that, finding the nervous system was influenced by colored light the professors soon perceived after experimenting with each hue that blue had an extraordinarily soothing effect on the nerves.
