HOBO BAND IS SUPREME

Efforts by Police to Drive Tramps From Baker City Suburb Prove Futile.

EUGENE GIRL TAKES POISON

Baker City Pastor Leaves—Local Option Paper Issued at Salem—Other News From Towns About the State.

Salem, Ore. Oct. 12.—Yew Park for several days has been infested with a band of 17 hoboes, and they defy the police and citizens. A number of petty depredations have been committed, but the fearless gang of semi-outlaws hold the fort and feast on the gardens, orchards and hen-roosts of the well-to-do Park people.

About a week ago the band made its first appearance in the peaceful suburb and established headquarters in an inviting and sheltered spot. Fancy friers, mealy spuds and luscious fruits commenced to disappear, but the strangers waxed fat and grew sassy.

Sunday morning their pilferings and general demeanor became unbearable, and the police were notified. A call from an officer resulted and the hoboes promised to move camp. They packed up their belonging, consisting of a few blankets, tin cans, and other light utensils, and left. The neighbors took a long breath, and thought the matter a closed incident, but imagine their surprise when the impromptu hotel was reopened late that evening.

A man, looking for his cow about dark, approached the camp, when he was assaulted with a rock, and stunned by a heavy blow on the head. A general call will be issued for the entire police force today, and they will go to the Park to "dare and do," as they are determined to drive the outfit out of the city, or introduce them to the calaboose and rockpile.

Society Girl Takes Poison.

Eugene, Ore. Oct. 12.—One of Eugene's leading society girls is reported to have taken a dose of poison with suicidal intent yesterday as the result of an unsuccessful termination of a love affair. It is further stated that the young man in the case made tracks for the depot and took the overland train for points unknown. Out of respect for the girl's parents names are withheld.

Irrigation Company Formed.

Eugene, Ore. Oct. 12.—The Washburne Irrigation company, has filed articles of incorporation with County Clerk Lee. The incorporators are C. W. Washbourne, H. Wicks, Thomas Bailey, T. J. Dorsey and N. P. Purkerson, all well known farmers residing west of Junction adjacent to the Long Tom river, from which stream it is intended to take the water for irrigation. The capital stock is \$1000, divided into 200 shares of the par value of \$5 each. The principal place of business is Junction City.

Local Option Paper Out.

Salem, Ore. Oct. 12.—Vol. 1, No. 1, of the local option campaign paper has been issued, and is edited by Prof. Drew, who has been the leader of the anti-saloon fight. The four pages are

filled with attacks on the city council and pretty much all the city and county and judicial officers. The district attorney is scored because he will not bring 40 suits. He says if he brought all the suits that are asked for by the Law Enforcement League he would involve Marion county in \$500 a month of costs and expenses.

Baker City Pastor Leaves.

Baker City, Ore. Oct. 12.—Rev. F. A. Lawson, pastor of the First M. E. church, has by the advice of his physician decided to locate in California and will within the next few days remove to Los Angeles, where he will make his future home.

Mr. Lawson had charge of the petitions for the enforcement of the local option law, and had received returns from five precincts, Eagle Valley, Unity Pine Number one, and two, and Rock Creek, where the voters had expressed an intention to see prohibition enforced.

Did Not Find Their Men.

Baker City, Oct. 12.—Sheriff Harvey Brown and his chief deputy, Jesse Snow, are home again after an absence of three weeks spent in a chase after Irvin and Barker, the two desperadoes who shot at Officer Boyd Lincoln when the latter attempted to arrest them for stealing grain from a rancher named Waltz. They did not encounter the desperadoes, who are supposed to be headed toward Ontario.

RESCUER WAS BASHFUL.

Coal Driver Saves Woman and Child, Then Departs.

Cincinnati, Oct. 12.—Although unable to swim and without a thought of danger, Mrs. T. N. Nanson plunged into the Ohio yesterday morning in an effort to save her child, which had fallen overboard from a houseboat at Central avenue.

Both would have drowned had it not been for William Kries, a coal driver, who leaped from his wagon and swam out to where mother and child were struggling in the water.

The child was soon restored, and while Mrs. Nanson was thanking her rescuer he climbed on his wagon and drove away without giving his address.

Mrs. Nanson is the wife of T. N. Nanson, junk dealer. With her husband she is on her way to Louisville.
