JEALOUS BOY KILLS SISTER

Child Two and a Half Years Old Makes Murderous Assault.

CORONER FINDS BOY GUILTY

Had Exhibited Before Evidences of Jealous Rage—Sister, Who Was a Month Old, Was Killed With Statue.

New York, Oct. 12.—Jealousy on the part of a boy two and a half years old against his baby sister, one month old, has led to the death of the latter at the hands of the boy. The tragedy occurred in the family of Nicholas Robenson, at Nyac, N. Y. Since the little girl came a month ago the boy exhibited many evidences of jealous rage. When attempts were made to interest him in the little one he frequently ran away crying, and once he upset the cradle.

Finally he was left alone for a few minutes in the room where the baby lay asleep. The boy was playing with a small bronze statue. Suddenly he cried to his mother "Hurry. Look at the baby."

She ran into the room and found the statue covered with blood. The baby's skull had been fractured and she was dead when the doctor arrived. At least six bruises were found on the head, all of which were struck before the mother was called.

After the inquest the coroner said: "It was a remarkable instance of infantile crime. The boy evidently thought he had been supplanted in the affections of his parents. The latter deserve great sympathy but I rendered the only verdict possible—that the baby was killed by her brother, whose tender age makes him irresponsible for the deed." When asked where his sister was after the funeral the boy replied: "Baby has gone away."
