Practically every dollar of the receipts are expended with Astoria merchants, the expenditures aggregating about \$10,000 annually. It frequently happens that patients are unable to pay for treatment, and in such instances the Sisters willingly bear the burden. The new hospital, twice as large as the present institution, will necessitate the expenditure of about twice the sum
