COCOANUT DROP COOKIES.—
These, like all drop cakes, are a boon to the busy cook, because they can be made in a very short time. Sift together one and a half cupfuls of flour and a rounding tenspoonful of baking powder. Beat one egg and half a cupful of sugar until light, add half a cupful of grated cocoanut and one-third teaspoonful grated lemon rind, then alternately the flour and one-half cupful of rich sweet cream. Drop in little pats on pans which have been buttered and dusted with flour and allow ample room for spreading. Sprinkle a little grated cocoanut over each cake and bake in a moderate oven.
