CHINESE BREAD.—Separate two eggs; add to the yolks one cup of sweet milk, one tablespoonful of butter, melted; one cupful of boiled rice, one cupful of white commeat and half a cupful of flour; beat well; add half a tenspoonful of salt, one tenspoonful basing powder; mix and stir in the well beaten whites of the eggs. Pour into a shallow, greased pan, having the batter half an inch thick. Bake thirty minutes, cut in squares and serve.
