COAL MINERS' STRIKE OFF.

Miners Are Looking for Jobs Elsewhere.

Denver, Oct. 18.—The strike of coal miners of district No. 15, United Mine Workers of America, which has been on for a year, has been practically closed up, according to a dispatch to the News from Trinidad, Colo.

The commissaries are closed, most of the tents having been taken down and the men are looking for situations wherever they can get them. All the men who were on strike up to October 10 were given union clearance cards.

It is understood that those of the strikers who desire transportation to other fields will be so provided. William Howells and John Simpson, president and secretary, will not be candidates for reelection for their respective offices at the miners' election, which occurs by referendum vote during this month.

Robert Smith seems to be in the lead for president, and Harry Douthwaite for secretary.

FELL FORTY FEET.

Portland Carpenter Met Instant Death.

A. F. Nordstrom, a Portland carpenter, was instantly killed on Monday by falling from a building in St. Johns. He fell a distance of 40 feet and his skull was shattered.

Nordstrom was placing rafters in the top of a building that is being erected by A. F. Cochran. He stepped on a cross-grained rafter which broke and he pitched headlong to the ground.

He was married and leaves a family, which resides in Portsmouth. The body was brought to the city at 2 o'clock this afternoon and prepared for burial.

PROPOSE A HAGUE MEMORIAL.

Monument to Be Erected in New York on Big Scale.

New York, Oct. 18.—Plans are being formulated for the erection in New York of a monument to commemorate The Hague Tribunal's mission among the nations. Those behind the scheme declare it will be among the largest and most majestic memorials in the world. A prominent society woman is said to have agreed to collect the necessary funds.

FIREMAN PROMOTED.

After Thirty Years' Service, John Campin Is Made Chief.

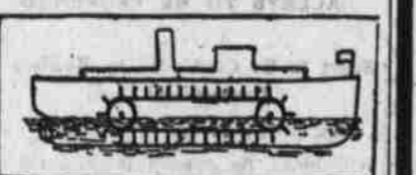
Chicago, Oct. 18.—John Campin, first assistant fire marshal, has been appointed chief of the Chicago fire department, succeeding William H. Musham, retired. Chief Campin has been a member of the department for more than thirty years and gradually worked his way to the top. As chief of the first battalion, he has had much experience in fighting fires. He is 63 years old.

A NOVEL YACHT.

It Is Propelled by an Endless Chain of Paddles.

The latest experiment in shipbuilding designed to reach a phenomenal rate of speed is now being constructed at Lawley's, South Boston.

It is a steel power yacht, which is expected to attain a speed of forty miles an hour, developing 1,500 horsepower.
