NO DESIRE FOR PEACE

Russian Journal Points Out Reason for Hostility to Proposed Arbitration.

PEOPLE WOULD FIGHT IT OUT

Development of Internal Capabilities Makes Continuance of War Necessary, Declares Newspaper.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 20, 7:55 a. m.—

The Novoe Vremya this morning deprecating the renewed talk of foreign intervention in the Russo-Japanese war, says:

"Such talk, if based upon the fact that now and then the voicing of an urgent desire for peace is heard in Russia, must reflect the marvelous ignorance or indifference on the part of foreigners to Russia's true internal condition. The fact is that in Russia, as in other countries, there are several parties; two of these want peace—the extreme reactionaries, because they constitute what was known in the United States during the Spanish-American war, and in England during the Boer war, as 'peace at any price men,' and the ultra-radicals, because they are in favor of humiliating peace which would weaken the present government. But these parties are insignificant beside the great body of moderate progressives, who wish to see Russia's interior economical capabilities developed to their fullest extent, and who realize that only through a decisive Russian victory in the far east can the wound be healed, not plastered. Russia has the opportunity for interior development on which their heart is set."

GOVERNMENT ERECTS SCALES.

Importers Will Save Usual Tax For Weighing.

San Francisco, Oct. 20.—The board of harbor commissioners has granted the request of the federal government for permission to erect three sets of standard scales along the city water front. The scales will be operated solely by government employes and they will have a capacity of 50 tons per load. The government will operate the scales solely and exclusively for the benefit of importers of merchandise at this port and the handling of foreign goods will thus be greatly facilitated. A great advantage to the local importers will lie in the fact that the government will make no change whatever for weighing the goods and the 6 1-4 cents which has hitherto been charged for weighing a ton of freight will thus be saved.

FUNSTON TALKS PATRIOTISM.

Would Prevent Desecration of Flags and Uniforms.

Chicago, Oct. 20.—The enactment of a federal law to prevent desecrating the American flag and caricaturing the uniform of the soldier has been advocated by Brigadier-General Funston at a banquet of the Illinois society, Sons of the American Revolution, at the Hamilton Club.

"The patriotism I believe in is to fight corruption at the primaries and the polls," he said. "There is no better way of emulating the founders of the republic."

The banquet was in commemoration of the surrender of Cornwallis at Yorktown.

FIRES IN CALIFORNIA.

Government Forestry Station And Other Property Destroyed.

Los Angeles, Cal., Oct. 20.—Forest fires raged all day yesterday in Santa Monica canon and the hills north of Sawtelle are still burning. Thousands of dollars worth of property have been destroyed by the flames and at one time the fire department was ordered to be in readiness to respond to an emergency call. The greatest damage was done in Santa Monica canon. The governmental forestry experiment station there was burned, entailing a loss of \$5000. Many homes were swept away in this district.

DIFFICULTIES REMOVED.

Carnegie Palace Of Peace Will Be Built.

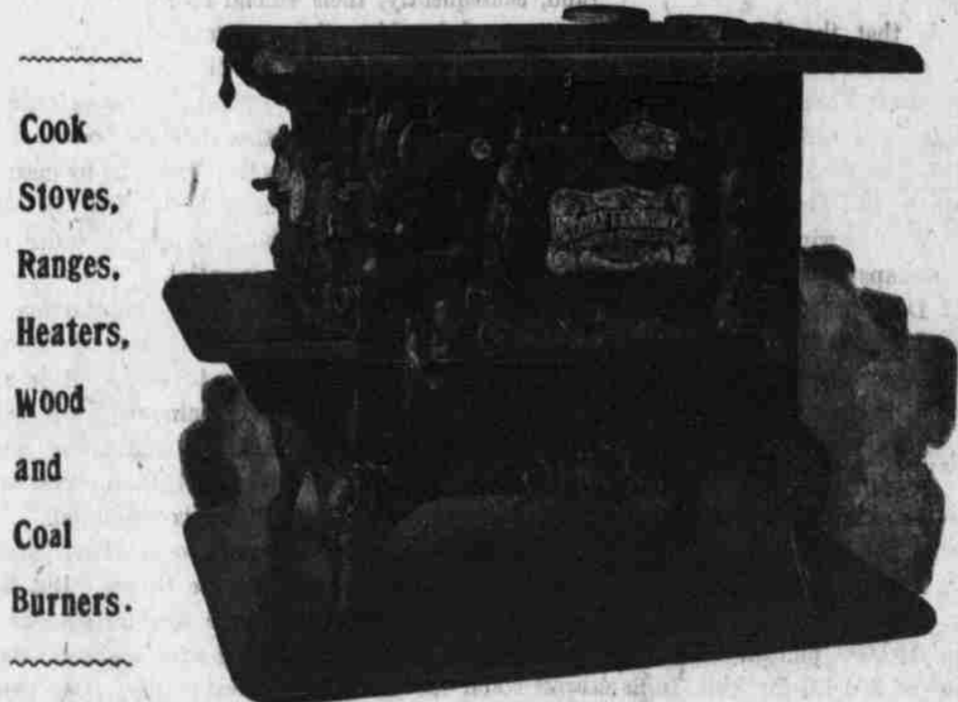
