

## HEROES ARE OF THE WEST

Dr. Newell Dwight Hillis Tells  
New Yorkers of the West—  
The Land of Workers.

### LUXURY OF SERVICE REAL

"I Am a Man Who Spends His  
Time Trying to Get Upon Ap-  
petite in You Who Are  
Gorged to Gluttony."

New York, Oct. 24.—In a sermon on the work of missionaries in this country during the last 100 years, the Rev. Dr. Newell Dwight Hillis, in Plymouth church, Brooklyn, has declared that the men of the west are the true moulders of the nation's destinies.

"So accustomed are we to thinking that Athens made Greece, that Rome made Italy, that Paris made France, that England is London," he said, "that we believe now that as New York goes, so goes the destiny of the United States. I do not mean that New York has no influence, but we have come to over emphasize ourselves."

"The boy who is nourished in the city, who all his life has breathed only the tainted air of the city and has been cramped by his surroundings, has no character. It is the boy who has been reared far from the complexity of city life that does things. Here a man loses his individuality. The men who will make themselves known 40 years hence are now husking corn in Nebraska."

The real preachers, Dr. Hillis went on, "are those whose work is done in the west," and he contrasted their field with his own, saying:

"I am a man who spends his time mixing tonics, trying to get up an appetite in you who are gorged to the point of gluttony."

"There is no pessimism beyond the mountains, no talking down of the institutions of this country. Those men have now begun a revival of patriotism to oppose the pessimism of you men of New York. It is the west that has furnished the heroes for the last two or three generations."

"Here you are eating many kinds of foods, pouring rich wines down your throats, saturating yourselves with all kinds of ease and luxury, and then preparing to die out of life when God has put you here for something better. You are not happy, but in seven days I could make you happy. Organize the resources of life in the interest of the poor and weak, and for misery you'll have happiness, for selfishness that corrodes, you'll have a blade that flashes more and more, and then you will know real luxury—the luxury of service."

about three per cent of the people in the world obtain their living directly from the sea.

The development of the dairy industry in the United States is scarcely realized by business men. In 1898 the butter haul over the Minneapolis and St. Louis railroad was four thousand pounds. **TROPICAL TOAST.**—Cut rounds of crustless bread one-fourth of an inch thick. Beat one egg very light and gradually beat it into a cup of milk. Lay the rounds on a platter and pour the mixture over them. Turn them so as to moisten both sides, then bake them in a little hot butter until brown. Serve with the following sauce: To a cup of seeded raisins add two cups of water, cover and cook slowly half an hour, then add half a cup of grated pineapple and half a cup of orange pulp cut in small pieces. Serve a spoonful of the sauce on each round of toast.
