

The papers generally publish without comment foreign telegrams concerning the sinking of the trawlers, indicating a desire not do embarrass the government or complicate an already extremely delicate situation by an expression of opinion before all the facts on both sides shall have been ascertained. One exception, particularly is the Novoe Vremya which says that one of the minor powers, before the sailing of the second Pacific squadron categorically informed Russia of an impending attack on the vessels. The paper begs that judgment may be suspended pending the receipt of Vice-Admiral Rojestvensky's report but declares that full
