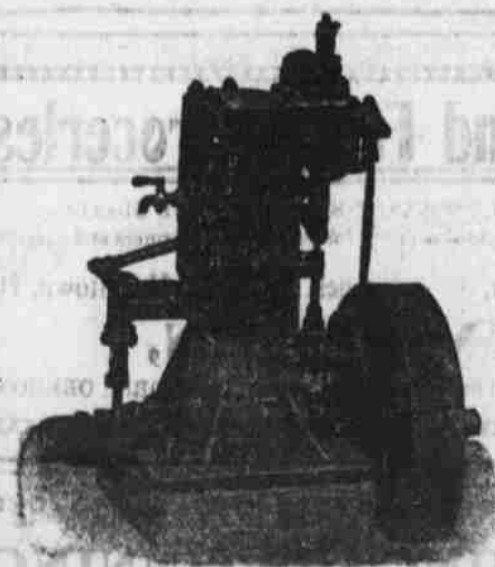

TURKEYS IN HORSE HEAVEN

How the Thanksgiving Staple is Produced on the Dry Stubble-fields of Klickitat.

ONE FINE HERD OF 640 BIRDS

Grasshoppers Their Favorite Food—Gobblers Enjoy the "Manly" Sport in the Ring.

The largest flock of turkeys in the northwest, according to the Pacific Homestead, is being herded on the stubblefields of Horse Heaven, in Klickitat county, Washington, about 50 miles west of Walla Walla. Six hundred and forty gobbling and squaking turkeys belonging to Mr. and Mrs. George H. Mottinger and Fayette Turney, who reside opposite Cold Spring station, across the Columbia river, on the Washington side, are being fattened on the scattered wheat, to be turned on the markets of Portland, Spokane, Walla Walla and Pendleton on Thanksgiving day and Christmas, says the Review.

Two years ago Mr. Mottinger rode over the hills to a neighbor and fetched home 10 turkey eggs in a lard pail. That season they raised 10 turkeys. All were kept, and the following year found a little flock of 75. Forty of them graced the tables on Thanksgiving, but 30 hens and four gobblers lived to pursue the festive grasshopper on the bare brown hills this year with the offspring.

This year they raised 650 from the result of bringing home the 10 eggs, and in July they were hauled over the hills to pick up their subsistence the best they could. Only a few died, and the herd today numbers 640 lively birds.

When first taken up the grasshoppers were so numerous that they arose in clouds before the herd, and it took the turkeys but a few minutes to catch their fill. After eating all they desired they felt the need of recreation. Soon a couple of lively young gobblers would start a fight, and the whole herd would form a ring around the combatants and apparently urge them on. Sometimes the contests became so exciting that it would be necessary to part the birds before they injured each other. Just before noon they would resume their foraging, and by noon their hunger would be satisfied and they could be driven to camp and watered. After noon would be the same performance until sunset, when the whole flock, with outstretched neck and wings, would half run and half fly to their roost for the night.

As the season advanced the grasshoppers have almost entirely disappeared and the flock had to learn to eat wheat. At first they did not take kindly to the change of diet, but soon became accustomed to it. Their conduct has changed since the grasshoppers vanished and they are considerably harder to manage. head of wheat, occasionally finding a beetle.

A few days before Thanksgiving a part of the herd will be slaughtered on the hills, where they have roamed through the summer, and packed for shipment to the city markets. After Thanksgiving the remainder of the flock will be driven down the mountains to the ranch on the river, and those not kept to raise another flock will supply the Christmas demand. Mr. Mottinger has not yet decided where he will market them, but says he will refuse all offers below 20 cents a pound, dressed weight.

The most interesting member of the flock is the mascot of the herd, a guinea hen. Last spring a guinea hen hatched her brood and there was one egg left unhatched, seemingly spoiled. It lays for three or four days in the warm spring sunshine, and one day a distressful cry was heard issuing from the egg. It was placed under a hen turkey and in a short time hatched out with the young turkeys. Since that time it has never left them. Its fellow fowls ignored it, and it, in turn, ignored them. Nothing was left for the little guinea hen but to live with its foster brothers and sisters, and when the time came for all to move to the hills it accompanied them. Today its "potrack" joins lustily with with the "gobbie, gobbie" and "tork, tork," of its adopted kin.

A moveable shed was constructed, 14x16 feet, with one side made of screen. In front of the shed is a pen about 45x45 feet, also built of screen, where the turkeys are kept at night. It was necessary to build the shed, as nightly droves of coyotes hover about hoping to steal the birds. The shed contains nine roosts 45 feet will only pick here and there at a

ly filled. It has been necessary to move the camp and shed eight times during the summer, as the pasturage became well picked over.

A four-horse team has been kept busy all summer hauling water and grit for the turkeys. One barrel of water and 50 pounds of granite crystals are needed by the herd daily. On the return trip the water man hauls a load of wheat to the warehouse at Wallula.

A herder on horseback and a dog long, and at night they are complete-

have been kept busy all of the time to keep the flock from straying. A man man is also needed to cook for the herder and water hauler, making three men necessary for the care of the flock.

The present outlook for good prices for turkeys is good. The Portland market will be well supplied from southern Oregon, as the dry season has proven a good one for turkey raising. Prices are quoted as high as 24 cents in Spokane, and that city will probably receive the larger share.
