

ENJOYED HIS VISIT.

Gov. Chamberlain Has Returned Home From California Trip.

"I had a real good time and there is no question at all that the people of San Francisco are pastmasters in the art of entertainment. They certainly showed by every courtesy, and I have the very kindest feeling for our neighbors of the south."

Thus spoke Governor Geo. E. Chamberlain at his office yesterday when seen by a Salem Statesman reporter after his return from the state of flowers, and olives, and wild honey.

Governor Chamberlain spoke at the Alhambra theater on Monday to a goodly audience, at which meeting Franklin K. Lane and ex-Mayor Jas. D. Phelan also spoke. He said that in the course of his remarks, which were, of course, devoted to the political questions of the day, he took occasion to mention the Lewis and Clark fair, and the mention thereof was received with a good deal of enthusiasm.

Speaking of the political situation in that while the democrats admitted that Roosevelt would carry the state, there was no doubt in their minds that they would reduce his majorities and the democrats also claim that they will elect one congressman more than they have now out of the list in the state. He reports a good deal of apathy in the campaign there, as is also encountered everywhere.

Governor Chamberlain said that the Lewis and Clark fair was attracting a great deal of attention in that state and that there would undoubtedly be a large attendance thereat from the south. In fact, Governor Chamberlain expects that California will attend in large numbers and also make great exhibits.

INTERNATIONAL FRAUD.

Insane and Paupers Sent to America to Enter Asylums.

San Francisco, Nov. 5.—A report from the local United States immigration inspectors has been forwarded to Frank B. Sargent, commissioner of immigration on certain frauds on taxpayers being perpetrated by aliens. The administration has discovered that in nearly every state in the union a large per cent of the inmates of asylums for orphans and aliens are sent to this country especially for the purpose of being placed in these institutions where better care and treatment are given than can be obtained in similar in-

stitutions in Europe. The report deals with institutions of the kind in this district. The facts will be presented to congress.

BET MINES ON ELECTION.

One is Staked on Parker Valued at \$600,000.

Silver City, N. M., Nov. 5.—Perhaps the largest bet that has been made so far this season on the result of the presidential election was recently made here between V. C. Place, general manager of the Pinos Altos Gold and Silver Mining company, of Grant county, New Mexico, and Charles M. Shannon, proprietor of a newspaper at Silver City. Mr. Place bets the new gold mill recently erected at a cost of \$40,000, and all the company's mines and property, including the mercantile house, on Roosevelt, against the Hughes and Shannon property, consisting of large copper mines and buildings at Clifton, on Parker. The necessary papers have been made out and placed in escrow pending the result of the election.

The Hughes and Shannon property at Clifton is valued at \$600,000, the present owners having refused \$400,000 for it. The property of the Pinos Altos Gold and Silver Mining company is in fine condition and is producing heavy monthly shipments of gold bullion. Mr. Shannon was an officeholder under Cleveland.

STOCKS ARE EASY.

Bull and Bear Influences Are About Equal.

New York, Nov. 5.—A lull in speculation stock market activity this week and an irregular action have been attributed to the varying effect of the heavy exports of gold, a temporary revival of the Anglo-Russian war scare and the approaching presidential election. Rumors of railroad deals have induced further speculative transactions. Risking prices of copper and sugar and the extension of the demand for iron and steel products have stimulated an important group of industrial stocks. Heavy returns of railroad earnings and the continued ease of money have afforded a resisting power to the market which held reactions in control and made possible an easy rallying power.
