THANKSGIVING IN NEW YORK

400,000 Turkeys Consumed-Most of Them Were Sold at 30 Cents per Pound.

GREAT CROWDS IN COUNTRY

650 Trains of 3000 Cars Carry 70,000 People From One Terminal to Points Located in New England.

New York, Nov. 24 .- More persons whose homes are in New York are spending the day in the country than ever before on a Thanksgiving, to judge by the records made in the various railroad stations. At one terminal about 650 trains with more than 3000 cars were handled which carried about 70,-000 passengers to New England and points up the state. It is estimated that more than 400,000 turkeys were city alone and most of this vast number were sold at 30 cents a pound.
