NEW MEDICAL IDEA

New York Physician Makes Discovery on Brain.

IF CORRECT IT IS VALUABLE

Brains of a Number of Scientific Men and Scholars Produced to Substantiate Dr. Siptzka's Revolutionary Medical Theory.

Philadelphia, Dec. 28.—A new theory of brain development has been propounded by Dr. Edward Anthony Siptzka of Columbia university before the Association of Anatomists at the University of Pennsylvania. It is, in effect, that the mentality is not dependent on the relative proportion of white and gray matter so much as upon the health of the great bundle of fibers known as the corpus callosum, which connect the two sides of the brain. In announcing his theory Dr. Siptzka exhibited the brains of more than a dozen men who had been eminent in science, and in each case endeavored to show that they bore out his assertions.

"The relative importance of the white and gray matter in the brain is often misconstrued," he said. "Were it not for the manifold connections of the nerve cells in the cortex with each other, as well as with the periphery by means of the millions and millions of fibers, which make up the white matter, such a brain would be as useless as a multitude of telephone or telegraph stations with all interconnecting wires destroyed."

"The corpus callosum is an index which places the brain of man so far over that of the brute. When this structure is deficient or diseased it is invariably attended by profound weak mindedness or total idocy. And the examination of the brains of three notable men possessing large capacity for doing and thinking shows the converse to be quite as true."

INTERNATIONAL GAMES.

England Will Send an All-Star Football Team.

New York, Dec. 28.—Negotiations are in progress between the New York Association Football League and the Corinthian Club of London, which are expected to result in a series of international games next season in New York, Philadelphia, Boston, Pittsburg, Chicago and San Francisco.

The Corinthian is the foremost association football club in England and numbers among its members all the best known amateurs. The team will probably arrive in Quebec in August and will play a series of matches in Canadian cities on its way to Vancouver. The return journey will be made through the United States and will be timed so that the team may reach her about the first week of October.

PECULIAR SUICIDE.

Nude Woman Leaps from Third Story Window.

New York, Dec. 27.—A woman of 21 years, known as Cazel Hall, has killed herself instantly by jumping from the third story window of a house near Broadway in West Forty-sixth street. Her action created a commotion in the neighborhood, where it was declared that the girl was screaming for help after which she was seen to fling her-

self in a nude condition headforemost from the window. Coroner Scholer took charge of the matter early today and gave it as his opinion that the girl was not a suicide, but had been detained against her will and was attempting to escape. Later he modified his statement somewhat pending further investigation. The woman's clothing was found scattered about the room from which she leaped.
