New York, Jan. 2.-The eastern pottery manufacturers are, according to a dispatch from Trenton, N. J., about to start a price-cutting war which promises to be one of the flercest ever waged in that trade and involves the question of supremacy between eastern and western manufacturers. Prices will, it is predicted, be very much reduced within a week

Portland, Jan. 2 .- J. H. Kelly, dock agent here for the Harriman lines, thinks the only practical manner in which ocean-going steamers can be loaded here without shifting through the bridges is to use proper lighters. the case during the winter and spring freshets, more or less danger is attached to the labor of moving the liners from the lower harbor above the bridges, and, Mr. Kelly's idea is to lighter all cargo to the ship rather than have her move so often. This would also prove advantageous, he thinks, in discharging, as the bulk of the cargoes are for rall points. At the present time there are no lighters in service that would answer the purpose.
