Portland, Jan. 6.—The local dealers are much exercised over a circular that has been sent out from San Francisco governing the situation in sugar.

The sugar situation has been such that the dealers have "laid low" waiting for reductions, as the fight between the Pacific and the Havemeyer interests developed.

True to their name hogs have hopped, they did it on the ascending scale, and the price today is 20 cents. Three thousand hogs were sold by a Tacoma firm at that price yesterday, and while hogs go up beer will go down—but not in price.
