DEFENDS MITCHELL

Representative Cushman of Washington Gives His Views.

BELIEVES MITCHELL INNOCENT

Regrets Tendency of Friends to Desert a Man Who Had Endeared Himself to His State by Years of Hard Service.

Washington, D. C., Jan. 9.—Representative Cushman today took up the cudgel in behalf of Senator Mitchell. Mr. Cushman deplored the tendency, whenever a faithful public servant is accused, among his friends to hold aloof.

"I for myself," declared Cushman, "do not for a moment think Senator Mitchell has been guilty of any wrong. The people of the west and northwest not only have a high regard for Senator Mitchell, but an affection for him that has been the growth of years of hard labor and hard service on his part in their behalf. That a man of his standing should have his character smirched by the testimony of a self-confessed scoundrel and one sensational expert is nothing short of an outrage, which will soon, in my judgment, be visited upon those who conceive and execute it.

"In my opinion the same is true of Representative Hermann, who is well and favorably known to the people of the Pacific coast. These people have confidence in his honesty and ability. When he was commissioner general of the land office one thing in his administration that everybody acknowledged was his friendship for and his sympathy with bona fide settlers on the public domain. I have full faith in the absolute vindication of both of these men."

CURTAIN RUNG DOWN.

Nellie Cummings, a Once Famous Actress, Dies in Frisco.

San Francisco, Jan. 9.—Nellie Cummings, an old-time actress of note, died here today, in poor circumstances, of asthma.

Miss Cummings was leading lady for John McCulloch and Lawrence Barrett at the old California theater in this city during the palmy days of the drama. After that time she drifted east, playing with many companies, notably those of Richard Mansfield, Frederick Ward and Edna Wallace Hopper. She has been playing brief engagements of late, until her health broke down.

ROMANCE REVEALED.

Extended from Calcutta to a New England Town.

Chicago, Jan. 8.—A romance begun in India at the time of the Sepoy mutiny, at which the principals were an ice dealer and a young woman, who met in Calcutta, and had been residents of the same New England town, has been brought to light at the death of James F. Toppan.

Mr. Toppan had resided in Chicago during 23 years. As a gold prospector in '49, as an ice dealer in Calcutta, as an inventor and a standard oil inventor, he was widely known. He was born in 1830 at Newburyport, Mass.

While in Calcutta, Mr. Toppan married Miss Juliet Atkins, whom he had known during his school days in Newburyport. When the Galena Oil Company of Franklin, Pa., of which he was manager, was incorporated into the Standard Oil Company, he retained a considerable interest in the concern.

Since his resignation he has engaged in the railway supply business in Chicago.

Proverbial Jury.
