

VEGETABLES HIGHER

Poultry and Eggs Feel the Cold-er Weather.

Fish Go Up in Price and Fresh Smelt Leave the Market—Fresh Meats Are in Good Demand—Other Produce Markets.

Portland, Jan. 10.—Large shipments of California fruit and vegetables are coming in daily by train and steamer, and are finding a ready local sale at first class prices.

Poultry and eggs are feeling the effects of the cold weather and better prices are quoted. Eggs still hover around 28 cents, but chickens are going up.

Fish are scarce, and there are no smelt at all. Fresh meats are in good demand.
