GAME CROWDS HENS

Geese and Ducks are Plentiful in City Markets.

Butter is Firmer in Tone, and the Renovated Article is Out of the Market—Fish Still Scarce and Meats in Good Demand.

Portland, Jan. 20.—The poultry market has slumped today from a rather unusual and unforeseen cause. Hunters have been exceptionally successful of late, and for the last few days the geese and ducks have been coming in until the retailers could supply them at low prices. The marketers immediately took advantage of this, and game has furnished the main of the Portland dinners for two days to exclusion of chickens, which went back a cent.

Butter is firm in price and the best is held around 32 cents, while renovated butter has been crowded out altogether by cheaper grades of "store" product. Wholesalers are selling most of their best brands for 27 1/2 cents.

Fish are scarce, there being very little salmon, and smelt are selling at wholesale for 5 cents. Fresh meats are in good demand with supplies rather light.

Apples are tending toward higher prices, as most of the inferior stock is being worked off and only the better grades are left.

Beet sugar is 10 cents off again, and is now selling for 20 cents less the hundred than cane sugar.
