Another matter that should be considered is the fact that all municipal and county officials are called upon every day to contribute to entertainments of various kinds; they are expected to buy one or more tickets to all charitable entertainments: assist in paying the expenses of churches and charitable organizations, and it cuts quite a hole in their income. The busiess of the city and county is in the hands of competent officials and they should be paid a salary commensurate with the constantly increasing duties of their respective offices.
