PRODUCE IS EASY

Poultry and Eggs Remain About the Same Price.

Butter Market Remains Firm—Carload of Sweet Potatoes Brings a Good Price in Crates—Slight Demand for Hops.

Portland, Jan. 31.—The signs in the produce market today are all favorable, and the prices realized today were fair.

The butter market is firm. A carload of sweet potatoes in crates arrived from California today and the innovation in the manner of shipping found instant favor on account of the economy in handling.

There is some demand for hops and a few sales are made, but the price remains around the 28c mark.
