BUTTER DROPPING

Quoted at Thirty Cents a Pound Yesterday in Portland.

Oregon Onions Are Reported Scarce and Eggs Drop a Half a Cent—Fish Continue Scarce and Difficult to Supply the Demand.

Fancy creamery butter dropped to 30 cents. For several days many dealers have found it difficult to get more than 30 cents, which was the cause of the drop. Oregon onions are reported scarce. Eggs dropped a half a cent. Fresh fish of all kinds continue scarce and there is not enough received to supply the local demand and none for shipment.

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
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
