DEATH OF DR. CARDWELL.

A Prominent Portland Physician Has Passed Away.
 Portland, April 3.—Dr. Herbert W. Cardwell, a well-known physician of Portland, died this morning at his home, 206 North Twenty-fourth street. The immediate cause of death was typhoid fever, from which Dr. Cardwell had been suffering 10 days. He had previously been afflicted with grip, which it is thought brought on the more serious malady.
 Dr. Cardwell had usually enjoyed fair health, and the news of his death will be received with surprise and regret by a large circle of friends.
 Dr. Cardwell was born in this city December 23, 1867. He was consequently 37 years of age. He was married 14 years ago to Miss Winslow, of New Bedford, Mass., and two sons Oliver Byron and Fowler are pupils of the city school.
 Dr. Cardwell accompanied the Second Oregon volunteers to the Philippines in 1898, as surgeon to the regiment. He afterward had charge of the government hospital at Ilo Ilo, and in all spent three years in the islands. His education was mostly obtained in Portland. After graduating from the Oregon Medical college here, he took a post graduate course in New York. Prior to his death he had worked up a large practice in Portland.

EQUITABLE LIFE.

Investigation of the Company's Affairs Commenced.
 New York, April 3.—The most important development in the Equitable Life Assurance Society's affairs today was the announcement tonight by Governor Higgins at Albany and by President James W. Alexander of the society of this city, that the state superintendent, Francis Hendricks, had begun an investigation of the company's affairs.
 This was followed by the introduction in the state senate tonight of a resolution providing for legislative investigation of the Equitable. The resolution was presented by Senator Brackett. The investigation by the state authorities follows a request made by Alexander to Superintendent Hendricks by a letter of February 21, and by Hyde in a letter, the announcement of which was made last Saturday night.

MORGAN SMITH.

Still Resisting the Requisition from New York.
 Cincinnati, April 3.—The contest by J. Morgan Smith and wife, relatives of Nan Patterson, against extradition and fight against the New York detectives will go hand in hand. This is indicated by the proceedings in the court today. Attorney Shay, for the defense, asked for time to prepare his answer.
 The court granted until Wednesday, when the habeas corpus proceedings will be disposed of. Shay was asked what he intended to do about the letters of Smith's, taken by the detective and sent to New York. He replied that action would be taken against the officers.

IN THE RING.

Twin Sullivan Whipped Young Fitzsimmons at Tacoma.
 Tacoma, April 3.—In the ninth round of a 20-round fight tonight, Young Fitzsimmons (Charley Jost) of Portland was defeated by Jack (Twin) Sullivan. A hard left to Fitzsimmons' jaw sent him to the floor and he was counted out. Throughout the fight Sullivan had the better of the argument.

South Sharon, Pa., April 3.—Jack Blackburn of Philadelphia knocked out Dick Fitzpatrick of Chicago in the second round of a 12-round bout tonight. Jack Young of New Castle and Paul Moore of Pittsburg went 10 rounds to a draw.
