EQUITABLE LIFE.

Investigation of the Company's Affairs Commenced.

The investigation by the state authorities follows a request made by Alexander to Superintendent Hendricks by a fetter of February 21. and by Hyde in a letter, the announcement of which was made last Saturday night.
