METHODIST BOOK

Commission of Clergymen Appointed for Unification.

DENOMINATIONAL INTERESTS

Commission Has Power to Adopt Any Statement Which May Be Presented for the Unification of the Denominational Publishing House.

New York, April 28.—A commission of Methodist clergymen and laymen appointed to pass on the unification of the denominational publishing house, known as the Methodist Book Concern, has held its first meeting in the office of the New York Methodist Book Concern.

The commission has power to adopt any statement which may be presented. It is headed by the Rev. Dr. J. R. Day, chancellor of Syracuse university. Among the members are the Rev. Dr. W. W. Evans of Central Pennsylvania, who has made a long study of denominational publishing interests; the Rev. Dr. W. H. Croghan of Atlanta, Ga., president of Clark university; R. H. Beggs, of Denver; the Rev. Dr. Dewitt Clinton Huntington, president of Nebraska Wesleyan university; H. H. C. Miller of Chicago; the Rev. Dr. C. U. Wade, presiding elder of Fort Wayne district, North Indiana conference; F. A. Chamberlain of Minneapolis, son-in-law of Bishop Foss; the Rev. Dr. G. A. Adicks, member of the St. Louis German conference; R. A. Booth, Eugene Pricer, Calvin Whitney of Norfolk, O., and J. E. Annis of Chattanooga, Tenn. No material progress was reported at the first session.
