No Change in the Quotations Yesterday.

Strawberries Arrive Very Slow and Are of Poor Quality—The Butter and Egg Markets Are Considered Weak With Large Supplies.

California strawberries are very scarce and what are shipped in are not up to the standard on account of the weather in California cooking them on the vines. The supply of butter continues to come in from local dairies and no change in quotations are noted. Eggs are plentiful and the price continues firm. Chickens are coming in but are rapidly disposed of at fancy prices.
