Pretty Rose Colored Boas for Evening Wear.

THE COVERT CLOTH JACKETS

They Will Be Much in Evidence During the Coming Season—The New Sleeves and Shoulder Arrangements. Short Jackets and Plaited Skirts.

Very lovely for evening wear are the delicate shades of rose colored ostrich boas. The curl of the feather gives a wonderfully foamy effect that is eminently becoming.

White panama cloth is to be very smart this season both for suits and separate skirts worn with silk waists.

The covert cloth jacket will be in evidence this spring in all the varying lengths. The only difference between the new jackets and those of last year is that in the recent models the bust is higher and the sleeves, which are of

vest. Over this vest are brille-like pieces of henrietta trimmed with crape, which are drawn into the waist with crape rosettes to form a girle. The sleeves finish at the elbow with double ruffles of mousseline de sole.

CHIC STYLES.

It is the sleeves and shoulders that govern the new styles. Miracles can be accomplished with the new sleeve trimmings and the right shoulder arrangements. Epaulets that form the top of the sleeve are a favorite adornment of the up to date sleeve.

With these plaited skirts will be worn short jackets with rather long fronts.

Mohair of the new silky weave is to be very much worn. It is particularly good style when in a checked design. Pale green and white, rose and white, and coral and white are new blendings.

Dozens of new girdles have come out. The linen craze has brought out inter-

esting developments in this line. They are embroidered in cotton matching the girle linen in color.

In the trimming line very stunning is an edging of tiny balls which is used in conjunction with net or lace.

Petticoats are made with adjustable sounces both in silk and muslin.

The waist pictured is of a tan and brown mixture carried out in burlingham silk. The fronts are cut in four pieces, with a seam running from shoulder to waist line. The seam nearest the side is slightly gathered at the

bust. Over a vest of tacked taffeta is a shawl collar of the silk edged with a braided design which crosses surplice fashion at one side. The chemise is of tucked white mull, and the sleeves are of leg of mutton trimmed with rounded turnover cuffs.

ODDS AND ENDS.

The smartest kind of shirt waists can be made of two hand embroidered linen pillowcases.

A dainty brown parasol is edged with three broad tracks of coarse ecru linen. Coats of pongee come for summer wear having collar and cuffs of suede.

The attractive hat seen in the cut is of gray chip simply trimmed with several shades of gray blue velvet about the crown. Where the hat folds and tilts at the side it is filled in with sprays of forget-me-nots.

EVENING DRESS MODES. White spotted tulle is the rage for young girls' evening frocks, and nothing is more suitable to the freshness of youth than this material. But it must be made over a vaporous skirt to give it a snowy effect. The most successful of these spotted tulle dresses have first an underskirt of taffeta covered with a second skirt of mousseline and then the tulle. On the bottom of the skirt is a wide Louis XVI. plaiting with a narrow ruching on each side

and here and there a chou of white satin ribbon. The bodice is cut lower in front than in the back. The sleeves have a circle of pink roses above foundings of tulle, leaving the arm bare beneath the roses. On one side of the decollete waist is a circlet of roses and on the other a ribbon bow.

Invisible checked taffeta is very much used both for the elaborate afternoon toilet and tailor made gowns.

An attractive checked taffeta in framboise color is made with a skirt stitched down in panels marked by bands of white soutache braid and its closely to the figure in the upper portion. Toward the base the soft silk is slightly draped in Louis fashion and caught up at intervals by tabs of embroidered linen over a full plaiting of the silk, creating a unique effect. The corsage is a semibolero cut up in broad straps, each bordered with a white braid passing beneath a girle, forming a tabbed back.
