California Strawberries Arrive But are Unfit for Sale.

Texas Onions Arrive But Too Late, as California Reds Can Be Sold Considerably Cheaper—The Egg Market is Overcrowded.

A large consignment of California strawberries were unloaded, but of very inferior quality, the poorest that has been received during the season.
