Portland, July 1.—There was little change in the complexion of the market today. Things along Front street were generally quiet. A number of large shipments of produce are due to arrive Monday and it is expected that these will go readily. Fruit is not coming in very well. Oregon potatoes are now holding their own against the California product. Eggs remain about the same and there is a slight rise promised in butter.
