Portland, July 3.—Front street will present a Sunday appearance all day tomorrow, as wholesalers have unanimously decided to take a whole day off.

Eggs were considered weak at 20c today on account of the large number of Eastern eggs placed on the market.

Potatoes of all kinds are plentiful and dealers advise Oregon growers not to dig just now, as the new potatoes will not keep and are placed on the market in competition with the more matured California product, which is cheap.
