Portland, July 5.—High prices for certain fruits are said to be caused by the establishment of many canneries within the last two years.

Some dealers quote Oregon eggs at 21 cents, but these dealers seem to be out of eggs at this time.

Salmon are scarce on account of cold storage men buying up the catch of the Lower Columbia.

Grain dealers are buying sparingly of wheat at present, and there is no speculation in their deals.

Oregon potato growers are not inclined to send in many potatoes now, in view of the low prices obtained.

Watermelons are becoming more plentiful from California and Texas, and are quoted at 2@2 1-2c per pound.
