Portland, July 17.—Butter is steady at quotations. Some Front street houses say that they would be glad to let go best grades of fancy creamery at 20c, while others report receipts cleaning up at that price.

Chickens stood well today, but there was no attempt to raise the price, as dealers did not think the market would stand an advance.

Large numbers of melons are coming in from California, where the crop is reported heavy this year.

Mill feed is in better demand, but prices are not likely to advance.

Small white beans are about gone and higher prices are looked for.

Evaporated peaches are out of the market, and dealers must wait for the new crop, which will appear in a few weeks.

Wholesale grocers are not laying in heavy supplies of sugar, and retailers only buy for immediate wants.
